save as many lives as possible." "From requesting and arranging the companies to provide them with relief material, food packs, coffee and tea powder, disposable water bottles, biscuits, and more to install, supply and serve at SMS Hospital," he added.

To date, they have provided 3,000+ ready-to-eat food packets, 11,000+ mineral bottled water, 4 coffee machines, 12,000+ cups coffee and tea ready-mix powder along with cups, 2,000 biscuit and muffin packets, and much more. JCF has pledged to support as much as possible. Along with this, JCF is also serving food packets to needy daily workers in hundreds every day.

## NO CASES AT ISHA



There are no positive cases of Coronavirus reported at the Isha Yoga Center in Coimbatore. The Yoga Center which receives several international visitors moved swiftly to put directives in place even before the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic and much before the central and state governments announced lockdowns and imposed travel bans.

Isha requested visitors from China, Japan, Singapore, and other COVID19 affected countries, not to travel to the Yoga Center as a precautionary measure both for travelers as well as the larger community. Even people who had been to the COVID-19 affected countries including transits and airport layovers were requested not to visit the Yoga Center. Isha has been following mandatory screening and physical distancing protocols ever since. Other foreign nationals who visited the Center were requested to observe a mandatory 28-day quarantine period.

## CORONA WARRIORS!

In the battle against Corona outbreak, Sikh community is continuously contributing to feed the needy and poor people, amid the nationwide lockdown. Jaipur Sikh Gurudwara Prabandhak Committee and Jaipur Sikh Samaj in association with Raj Khalsa Aid are preparing food at all the Gurudwaras in the city and making the food packets, dry Ration and hygiene friendly products available to more than 10,000 people in the city on a daily basis.
