Polling is now complete in 14 States/UTs in the first two phases

Moni Sharma Jaipur/New Delhi

In the scorching heat of the second and final phase of the Lok Sabha election in Rajasthan, voter turnout surpassed 64% in 13 out of 25 constituencies on Friday. Across most constituencies, polling was brisk, with queues forming outside booths early in the morning. The Barmer constituency recorded the highest turnout at 73.68%, followed closely by Banswara at 72.24%, contributing to the state's average turnout of 64.02%. During Phase 1, the desert State witnessed a 58.28% voter turnout. Meanwhile, in Phase 2 of polls conducted in 88 seats across 13 states/UTs on Friday, nearly 61% of voters cast their ballots. Tripura and Manipur led with highest voter turnouts at 78.53% and 77.18%, resp, while UP recorded lowest turnout at 53.71%. **P2, 5 & 8**

DSP Amarjit Chawla said that the deceased have been identified as Hetram (45), Sunita (42), Lichma Devi (55), Vidya Devi (40), Kalavati Devi (48) and Kanta (35). The driver of the car, Ramesh (38), tried to overtake the trailer going towards Raisinghnagar. Meanwhile, a bus was coming from Raisinghnagar towards Anupgarh. The driver could not overtake and collided with the trailer. After the accident, the driver of the trailer fled the spot.

In Dauas, a speeding car crushed 11 people sleeping by the roadside in Mahwa town. Three people died while eight were seriously injured. Two injured are undergoing treatment in the government hospital in Mahwa, while six seriously injured have been referred to Jaipur. The accident happened on Thursday night. Police have confiscated the car.



Led by Sanju Samson, the Royals have had a great first half of the season, igniting hopes of a second title triumph with 7 wins out of their 8 games. Except for KKR who have so far lost just two games, all other teams have lost 3 or more

matches this season. After their first championship victory, the subsequent years saw a dip in RR fortunes, leaving their loyal fans yearning for more. In the 15 previous seasons of the IPL, besides their triumph in 2008, the Royals have reached the finals just once, in 2022 (they were also banned for 2 years in 2016-2017). But this year,



With the IPL juggernaut rolling into its second half, the RR continue on a triumphant march this season. In IPL 2024, the Royals have played with such flair that after a 16-year wait, RR fans are eagerly anticipating a shot at the IPL trophy. Chahal's milestone feat of becoming the first bowler to claim 200 IPL wickets underscores his impact on the game.

AND WHAT ABOUT **VIOLATION OF RIGHTS** IN THE UNITED STATES

hile America portrays India as a friend and vital strategic ally, it simultaneously releases recurring reports that are critical of India, making one doubt its sincerity as an ally. In the latest instance, the US State Department has voiced concern over alleged serious human rights violations in Manipur last year, extra-judicial killings, attacks on minorities, journalists and dissenting voices. The report comes at a time when pro-Palestine protesters are being driven away from university campuses across the US. Released by US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, the report accuses India of not acting against officials responsible for rights violations.

Should this report be given a serious thought when one Indian origin man was shot dead by the US police as they tried to apprehend him and an Indian student, Achintya Shivalingam, was arrested for taking part in the pro-Palestine protest? It is time to question the human rights abuses in the US and push aside the "biased" State Department report.

SC SETS DOUBTS ON VVPAT TO REST



he Supreme Court has dismissed pleas seeking 100 percent cross-verification of EVM-VVPAT (Voter Verifiable Paper Trail) slips. The Bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta summarily rejected pleas for going back to ballot paper system of voting, full EVM-VVPAT verification and giving VVPAT slips to voters for being put in ballot boxes. At the very outset the prayers were impractical and deserved to be rejected.

Return to the old ballot box system which made elections look farcical because of the extent of bogus

voting that took place would have been retrograde and a mockery of the democratic process. Complete verification of E v M-VVPAT to ensure there was no bogus voting would have made the electoral process more timeconsuming and cumbersome.

The petitioners pleaded that instead of cross-verification of the EVM-VVPAT slips in only five randomly selected polling stations in each assembly constituency, all VVPATs should be verified. The Election Commission opposed the prayer as it amounted

The Bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta summarily rejected pleas for going back to ballot paper system of voting, full **EVM-VVPAT** verification and giving VVPAT slips to voters for being put in ballot boxes. At the very outset the prayers were impractical and deserved to be rejected

to doubting the functioning of EVMs and VVPATs on "vague grounds". Justice Datta spoke against "blindly distrusting" any aspect of the system. The Bench issued two directions which should allay any doubt in the minds of petitioners. One, sealing of Symbol Loading Unit (SLU) once the symbol loading process is over. The order will be applicable on or after 1. 05. 2024. The SLUs have to be kept in sealed containers in strong rooms along with EVMs. Two, the court ordered technical verification of 5 percent EVM's control unit, ballot unit and VVPAT per assembly segment after the announcement of results to check tampering.



With completion of voting on 13 Lok Sabha seats in the second phase, the fate of candidates on all 25 seats of Rajasthan has been sealed in EVMs. In whose favor voters have decided, it will now be revealed on June 4. It is a matter of satisfaction that the hard work of political parties and the Election Commission, which became active after low voting in the first phase, bore fruit. In the second phase, about seven percent more votes were cast than in the first phase. There was 58.28 percent voting on 12 seats in the first phase, while the voting figure on 13 seats in the second phase has now reached 64.56 percent. After the updation, when the final figures come by Saturday, this voting percentage may be higher. At present, there was 3.86% less voting on these thirteen seats compared to the last LS polls. This time, a total of 61.60% voting took place on 25 seats, which is about



The special thing in second phase was that this time percentage of voting on two seats - Kota and Barmer - crossed the figure of 2019 whereas in Banswara it remained very close to the last time. Voting on remaining ten seats was less than last time. In the last LS polls, there was 70.22% voting in Kota, 73.30% in Barmer and 72.90% in Banswara. After late night updation, the voting figures were 70.82% in Kota, 73.68% in Barmer and 72.24% in Banswara. Are you one of the millions about to have Cataract surgery?

ataract surgery is one of the most popular and com-

monly performed procedures in the world. The vast majority of patients have excellent outcomes with few complications.

HERE ARE THE NUMBERS:

- By age 80, over half of all Americans have cataracts.
- Close to 4 million cataract surgeries are performed in the U.S. every year.
- Over 90% of patients have 20/20 vision with glasses after surgery, although those with other eye conditions may not do as well, including those with glaucoma, a progressive disease typically associated with elevated pressure within the eye; diabetic retinopathy, which ultimately can cause leakage in the retinal tissues; and macular degeneration, a disease that is typically related to age.
- The rate of post-surgery infection from endophthalmitis is less than 0.1%.

As ophthalmologists who have performed thousands of these procedures, we know that many patients have misconceptions about both cataracts and the surgery. For example, some think a cataract is a growth on the eye's surface.

We like to compare a cataract with the frosted glass of a



bathroom window, where light can be transmitted but details cannot. Or when turbulence from a storm causes normally clear water in the ocean to become murky. In much the same way, the eye's once-transparent lens becomes cloudy.

COMPLICATIONS ARE RARE

Serious complications, such as postoperative infection, bleeding in the eye or a postoperative retinal detachment are rare; they occur in approximately 1 in 1,000 cases. But even in many of these situations, appropriate management can salvage useful vision.

Capsular complications deserve additional discussion. According to some studies, they occur in up to 2% of cases. If a hole or tear of the posterior capsule is encountered during cataract surgery, the clear gel in the vitreous – the back chamber of the eye – may be displaced into the front chamber of the eye.

If that happens, the gel must be removed at the time of the cataract surgery. This will reduce the likelihood of additional postoperative complications, but those who have the procedure, known as a vitrectomy, have an increased risk for additional complications, includ-

ing postoperative infections and postoperative swelling.

AFTER THE SURGERY

Patients usually go home right after the procedure. Most surgery centres require that the patient have someone drive them home, more for the anaesthesia rather than the surgery. Patients begin applying postoperative drops that same day and must wear an eye shield at bedtime for a few weeks after surgery.

Patients should keep their eyes clean and avoid exposure to dust, debris and water. They should try not to bend over and should avoid heavy lifting or straining in the first week or so after surgery. Lifting or straining can cause a surge of blood pressure to the face and eyes. Known as a choroidal haemorrhage, it can lead to bleeding into the wall of the eye and be devastating to vision.

Things that cause only moderate increases in heart rate such as walking are OK. Routine postoperative examinations are usually completed the day after surgery, about a week after surgery and a month after surgery.

A CHOICE OF LENS

The plastic lens used to replace the cataract or intraocular lens requires careful sizing for optimal results and a nuanced discussion between patient and surgeon.

Early intraocular lens technologies were monofocal, and most patients with these lenses chose distance correction and used reading glasses for near tasks. This is still the preferred approach for approximately 90% of patients having cataract surgery today.

Recent advances have led to intraocular lenses that offer multifocality – the opportunity to have near as well as distance vision, without glasses. Some multifocal lenses are even in the trifocal category, which includes distance, near, and intermediate vision, the latter of come very important for com-

puter and phone use.

Most patients with these advanced technology multifocal lenses are happy with them. However, a small percentage of patients with multifocal lenses can be so bothered by visual disturbances – notably night glare and halos around light sources in the dark – that they request the removal of the multifocal lens to exchange it for a standard intraocular lens. These exchanges are a reasonable option for such situations and offer relief for most affected patients.

Determining who's an ideal candidate for a multifocal intraocular lens is an area of active research. Most clinicians would recommend against such a lens for a patient with a detail-

As with many technologies, current generation advanced technology intraocular lenses are much better than their predecessors. Future offerings are likely to offer improved vision and fewer side effects than those available today.

However, these newer lenses are often not reimbursed by insurance companies and often entail substantial out-of-pocket costs for patients. Deciding on what type of lens is best for you can be complicated. Fortunately, except in unusual circumstances, such as when a cataract develops after trauma to the eye, there is seldom a hurry for adult cataract surgery.




