MONSOON SURGE SOLVES DRINKING WATER WOES

Water level at Bisalpur Dam rises after heavy rains; nears 313.56 M

After good rainfall in Chittorgarh and Bhilwara, Bedach, Menali & Banas are flowing together

Thanks to a favorable monsoon, the water level at Bisalpur Dam, crucial for Jaipur and Ajmer, has risen to 313.56 RL meters.The current water level of the dam has reached 313.56 RL meters. Due to good rains in Bhilwara, Chittorgarh and Rajsamand, the height of Triveni in the dam's flow area has reached 4.35 meters.

This monsoon has already delivered nine months' worth of water in Bisalpur dam, with expectations for further increases due to upcoming rains. Since inflow began on August 6, the water level has been steadily rising.

After good rainfall in Chittorgarh and Bhilwara, Bedach, Menali and Banas are flowing together. The water level of Triveni is running at a height of 4.35 meters. The water level of the dam is expected to reach 313.90 RL meters by Monday morning.

Bhopal-bound flight evacuated after engine failure on runway







People hit the streets in different parts of Assam on Sunday, protesting the alleged gang rape of a 14-year-old girl in Nagaon district and demanding exemplary punishment for the culprits.

The girl was allegedly raped by three persons, who came on a motorcycle and surrounded her while she was returning home from tuition on her bicycle in Dhing on Thursday evening.

At Dhing, shops and business establishments reopened today after two days of spontaneous closures to protest against the crime. A march was held in the area demanding the arrest of the remaining culprits and exemplary punishment for them.

The prime accused, who was arrested on Friday, in the rape case allegedly escaped from custody, jumped into a pond and died on Saturday morning, police said.

The other two accused are still absconding and search was continuing for them. "We want the culprits to be arrested soon and they should be given exemplary punishment," Farida Begum, one of the protesters, said.

India, Indonesia resolve to boost anti-terror cooperation

India and Indonesia have Pavel Durov, the Ruscondemned the use of terrorist proxies for cross-border terrorism amid Pakistan's support to terror groups carrying out terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir.

The issue of crossborder terrorism figured at the sixth meeting of the India-Indonesia joint working group on counter-terrorism that was held in Jakarta on Friday.

The two sides focused on ways to effectively combat terrorism, including how to stop the use of new and emerging technologies by terrorists, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

"India and Indonesia strongly condemned terrorism in all its forms and manifestations and emphasised the need for strengthening international cooperation to combat terrorism in a comprehensive and sustained manner," it said in a statement on Sunday.

The MEA said the two sides also condemned the "use of terrorist proxies for cross-border terrorism." "The two sides exchanged views on the domestic, regional and global terrorism threat assessment," it said.

French authorities arrest Telegram CEO at a Paris airport: Report

sian-born billionaire founder and owner of the Telegram messaging app, was arrested at Le Bourget airport outside Paris shortly after landing on a private jet late on Saturday and placed in custody, a police source said.

The arrest of the 39-year-old technology billionaire prompted on Sunday a warning from Moscow to Paris that he should be accorded his rights and criticism from X owner Elon Musk who said that free speech in Europe was under attack.

There was no official confirmation from France of the arrest, which French and Russian media have also reported, saying that Du-

rov was arrested shortly after arriving at Le Bourget airport on a private jet from Azerbaijan.

France's BFM and TF1 said that Durov, who has dual French and United Arab Emirates citizenship, was arrested as part of a preliminary police investigation into allowing possible criminality due to a lack of moderators on Telegram and a lack of cooperation

with police. Reuters' police source could not confirm that.
